## Grants and Fundraising

Activities aren't cheap, folks! One way to raise funds is to apply for grants. A Community Action Pride (CAP) grant writing request is currently underway. If we are funded, this will help cover the costs for things like the annual summer barbecue and other activities we enjoy, as well as help to pay for the printing and mailing of the *Vendome Voice*. Other fundraising efforts will be underway this year, so stay tuned!

The Vendome Neighborhood Association Board of Directors is applying for non-profit 501(c)(3) status. Why? So fund raising donations can be reported accurately, and donations you make can be tax-deductible (please check with your tax advisor). This may also make the VNA eligible for many more grants.

There is a lot of paperwork involved, so while we're working on it, the Board of Directors may consider joining United Neighborhoods of Santa Clara County (UNSCC) for one year. They have non-profit status and offer event insurance.

## Ryland Pool

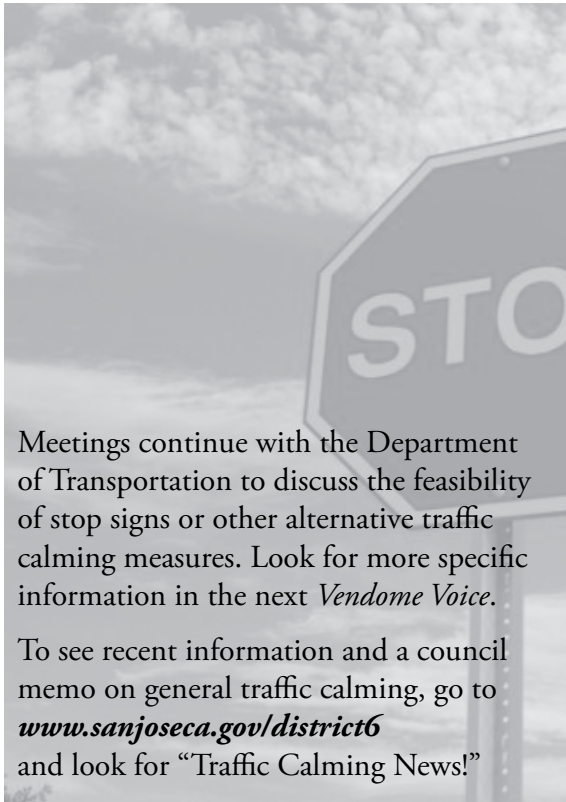
The re-opening of the pool is one project with two separate "tracks": construction to get the pool open and running, followed by historic rehabilitation.

**UPDATE ON TRACK I.** The pool will be under construction until late May or early June. The official opening is June 23rd, which is when the City of San Jose Aquatics Season starts.

## Neighborhoods Commission

The San Jose City Council approved the creation of a two-year Neighborhoods Commission pilot, in autumn of 2007. Since that time, work has been ongoing to prepare for Commissioner selection. Through a formal caucus, neighborhoods will select their district representative, who will be ratified and appointed by the Council.

Our new Neighborhoods Commission will advocate for all San Jose neighborhoods. Its mission is to integrate the voice of neighborhoods into the City’s decision-making processes.

Help your community by volunteering for an hour or two to pick up litter. The City of San Jose provides free supplies.

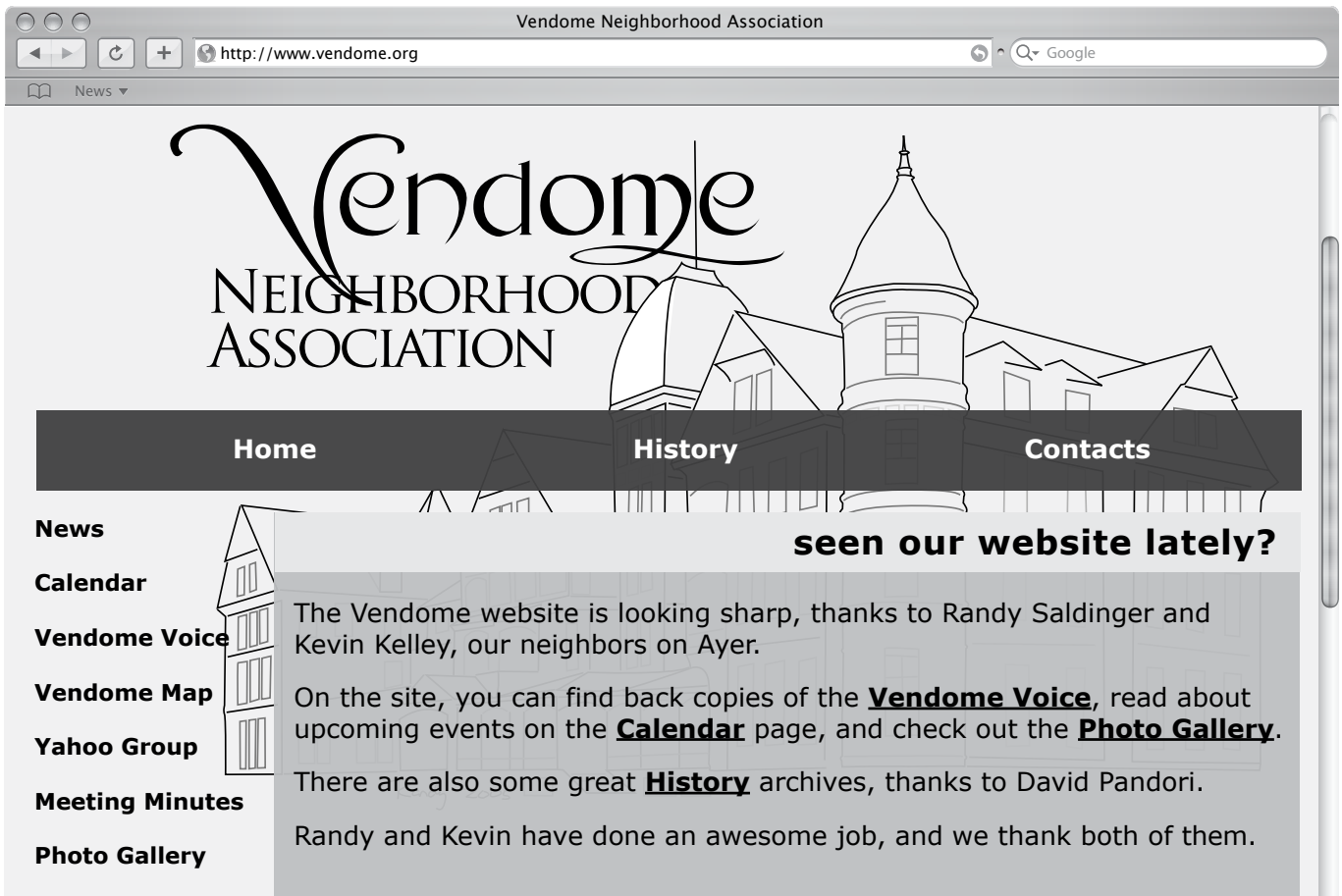

UPDATE ON TRACK 2: The historic rehabilitation of Ryland Pool is scheduled to begin after the 2008 Aquatics season. An Architectural Conservator will be hired to prepare a report, detailing the necessary steps for historic rehabilitation. Fundraising continues — the City has allocated funds for Track 1 only — to be applied to the rehabilitation, as outlined by the Architectural Conservator.

There will also be the a commemorative plaque detailing the pool's history. In addition, City Landmark status is being pursued for the pool.
